### **EXTRA-ORDINARY NEWS!**

2021 has been an extraordinary year of activity and busy-ness for us all in IBVM. From Convocations to Bicentenaries we have had many special events and reasons to celebrate. We are grateful that the On Pilgrimage with Mary Ward App has been updated and is now available in English, German and Spanish.

An important event in 2021 was the CJ General Congregation Part 1 which took place online from July 14<sup>th</sup> to August 8<sup>th</sup>. This was a new experience for all involved and was carefully choreographed with precise management because of time-differences ranging from Korea to South America.

51 CJ delegates and 8 IBVM representatives participated in an open process that was new for all. 6 more IBVMs were present in supportive ways as secretary, translators, facilitators and liturgy group. A prayerful ritual for the beginning and end of each day and the three big celebrations, that all members of both congregations could attend, were carefully prepared by the liturgy group. Each person also belonged to a small group that met daily to share on the gospel of the day. Through the Uprocess the participants were led through a collective sensing of the body of the CJ in the world, and addressed many emerging themes. The whole event ran smoothly thanks to the valuable technical support of Esther Finis and her creative use of digital technology, allowing us to use new tools including padlets, website and breakout rooms.

The CJ General Congregation Part 2 will take place from August 21<sup>st</sup> to Septmebr 12<sup>th</sup> 2022 in person in Nemi, just outside Rome. Below is their newly adapted logo. 
students and parents to share on the 1<sup>st</sup> 20 years of the Institute in India.

She spent two and a half weeks in this hospital getting acquainted and experiencing the Zambian medical system.

Mary sat for the General Nursing Council Exam as part of a requirement to obtain a provisional Nursing Practice Certificate. She secured a provisional Practice Licence that gives her the credential to carry on with her assigned responsibilities as nurse and educator while awaiting Registration confirmation after six months.

For the past seven and a half years, Mary was an employee at Mater Misericordiae Hospital Nursing College Nairobi, Kenya, and worked as a full-time staff member. Mary was a valued educator, nurse practitioner, colleague, and team member in the hospital. Alongside her many responsibilities at the hospital, Mary was a part-time member of the IBVM Eastern Africa Province leadership team.

In moving across borders Mary was very positive and generous to leave ministries in Kenya that she loved. We are grateful as Mary takes on this new ministry to go to where the need is greatest in the new Nursing College in Lukulu, Zambia scheduled to open 20<sup>th</sup> November 2021.

<u>Darjeeling founded in 1846</u> Mother Teresa M. Mons along with Mary Joseph Hogan, three sisters and an orphan girl in the entourage, started their journey on 10<sup>th</sup> August 1846. A perilous expedition with rain as their constant companion, they journeyed up the river Ganges for seven weeks. They reached Darjeeling 10<sup>th</sup> October 1846. The inaugural Mass was held on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2021 followed by cultural programming online. Teresa Dease and four companions land in **Toronto Canada September 16, 1847**.

In collaboration with St. Michael's College of the University of Toronto and the Congregation of St. Joseph Sisters a *five online lecture series* has begun. The first lecture on October 18 honoured the contributions of the CSJ (170 yrs) and the Loretto IBVM (175 yrs) to higher education at SMC for over 100 years. The third lecture on Social Justice and the fifth one on the Truth and Reconciliation

Commission will be hosted and led by IBVM. We will hold the BIG celebration when we can gather students, alumnae, friends, etc. together post Covid and also when the renovation of Loretto Abbey High School is completed so the chapel can be used. Eastern Africa 1921 six sisters arrived in Mombasa on 18<sup>th</sup> October 1921, Dolores Stafford, Raphael Gordon, Borgin O'Shaughnessy, Catherine Beauvais, Francis Teresa Murphy and Sixtus Naughton. On that same day they embarked on a journey to Msongari in Nairobi, where they laid the first Foundation. From this one mission, 24 other missions have since been established. On 18<sup>th</sup> October 2021, being the province actual founding day, the sisters held celebrations in their communities in thanksgiving for the founding sisters. The communities had mass/ prayers, special meals, charitable outreaches and care of the earth-oriented activities.


### **INTRODUCING: A. NIRMALA**


